# MOLEFI KETE ASANTE, PhD Professor & Chairperson, Department of African American Studies Temple University, Philadelphia

Dr. Molefi Kete Asante is a professor and Chairperson of the Department of African American Studies at Temple University in Philadelphia. He is considered by his peers to be one of the most distinguished contemporary scholars in the country.

Professor Asante is the author of 32 books, the latest of which is entitled Thunder and Silence: The Mass Media in Africa. Dr. Asante received his Ph.D. at age 26 and was appointed to a full professor at 30. He established the first doctoral program in African American Studies in the world. Dr. Asante has authored more than one hundred scholarly articles, founded the Afrocentric philosophical movement, and the National Afrocentric Institute. He has directed 42 doctoral students, many of whom now serve in important posts throughout the world.

Born in Valdosta, Georgia and educated at UCLA, he worked in Zimbabwe as a trainer of journalists. He is a poet, dramatist, painter, and a gardener. He is Chairperson of the Board of GRIO, an educational magazine, and founding editor of the Journal of Black Studies. Additionally, Dr. Asante is a curriculum consultant for the several large School Districts. An activist scholar, Dr. Asante believes that it is not enough to know, one must also act to humanize the world.

### VIVIAN VERDELL GORDON, PhD Professor, Department of Africana Studies State University of New York at Albany

Dr. Vivian Verdell Gordon is a professor in the Department of Africana Studies at the State University of New York at Albany. A popular speaker and community activist, Dr. Gordon has served as a guest scholar in residence and a visiting professor at Gettysburg College, Savannah State University, Wellesley College, and Northeastern University. Prior to joining the faculty at Albany, Dr. Gordon was a faculty member in the Department of Sociology at the University of Virginia, where she also served for five years as the Director of the African American Studies Program.

Dr. Gordon is among those Afrocentric scholars seeking to develop new models and paradigms for the study and evaluation of the African American experience. She is the author of several books and has also contributed articlaes to various professional publications. In addition, she has made numerous presentation and conducted workshops on the topics of race, ethnicity, gender, and cultural diversity.

Dr. Gordon earned her B.S. degree from Virginia State University, the M.A. in Sociology from the University of Pennsylvania, and a Ph.D. degree from the University of Virginia. She is the recipient of numerous awards including awards for outstanding service to students and the community. She recently received the Zora Neal Hurston/Paul Robeson Award for distinguished scholarship.




### HARRY EDWARDS, PhD Professor, Department of Sociology University of California at Berkeley

Dr. Edwards, presently Professor of Sociology at the University of California at Berkeley, is the founder of the Discipline of Sports Sociology that focuses on the relationship between American sports and society and their effects on racial equality. He is considered an expert on the racial, political and economic issues of sports, society and education. He has distinguished himself by serving as a Special Assistant to the Commissioner of Major League Baseball and serving as a consultant with producers of sports related programs on NBC, CBS, ABC, and the PBS Television Network.

Dr. Edwards has written and published more than 60 articles and reviews and serves as contributing editor to numerous newspapers and magazines. He is a native of East St. Louis and is married with three children.

# DEBORAH P. WOLFE, PhD Chair, New Jersey Board of Higher Education and Professor Emerite of Education Queens College of the City University of New York

Dr. Deborah Partridge Wolfe formerly served as Education Chief with the committee on Education and Labor of the House of Representatives. During her tenure, 35 public laws effecting education and labor were passed. Dr. Wolfe worked in education for many years, having taught on all levels from kindergarten through graduate instruction. She has been a classroom teacher, principal, college professor, and department chairperson. Before going to Queens College, Dr. Wolfe served on the professional staff of Tuskegee Institute as Head of the Department of Elementary Education, and Director of Graduate Work. She has also taught at Grambling University, New York University, Fordham University, University of Michigan, Texas College, Columbia University, University of Illinois, and Wayne State University.

Dr. Wolfe has held leadership positions in a host of associations and educational organizations and has received numerous awards and honors across her illustrious career including the naming in her honor a Junior-Senior High School in Macon, Georgia, and a dormitory at Trenton State University. Twenty-three institutions have conferred on Dr. Wolfe doctorates of Literature, Letters, Humane Letters, and Laws.

Dr. Wolfe received her doctorate in Education from Columbia University and has studied as Vassar College and the University of Pennsylvania. She also studied theology at Union Theological Seminary and the Jewish Seminary of America. She was ordained to the Christian ministry in 1970. She serves as Associate Minister of the First Baptist Church of Cranford, New Jersey.





# ANDREW HACKER, PhD Professor, Department of Political Science Queens College of the City University of New York

Dr. Andrew Hacker is presently a professor of Political Science at Queens College. He received his B.A. from Amherst, MA from Oxford, and a PhD from Princeton. Prior to joining the faculty at Queens, her served as a professor in the Department of Government at Cornell.

Dr. Hacker has written a number of articles in major journals and contemporary magazines. In addition, he has authored over eight books including his recent, <u>Two Nations: Black and White: Separate, Hostile, Unequal.</u>

This latest work has generated a good deal of public discussion across the country in both the print and television media. Recently, Dr. Hacker was featured in Essence magazine and on the Oprah Winfrey show.

Dr. Hacker is a native of New York City and is married with one child.
